## Mandatory Evacuation Drill

There will be a mandatory, full-building evacuation drill on Wednesday, Sept. 25th. The drill requires that we evacuate the building and move to our Assembly Area. Due to construction in the area, everyone will exit the building and walk up 6th Avenue to Centre Avenue and across Washington Place into the PPG Paints Arena parking lot, our designated Assembly Area.

This is a mandatory drill, required of each Pittsburgh high-rise building every three years. Representatives from Pittsburgh Emergency Management, Fire, Police, EMS and the Department of Homeland Security will be on site. During the drill, no one will be permitted access into the building. Our last drill (in 2016) took approximately 90 minutes from evacuation to re-occupation.

While we realize this is an interruption in your day, it is a vital exercise to help ensure your safety and the safety of all tower tenants and guests in the event of an emergency. The drill provides important information to first responders, identifies where changes or improvements should be made to our plan, and helps us determine the best way to ensure the safety of tenants with special needs. Please plan your day and any office appointments accordingly.
