New Features Coming Soon to the App



The U.S. Steel Tower app is about to get even better – putting everything you need at your fingertips for the best tenant experience.

Coming soon, you'll see a new blue tile on the app's main page called "Reserve Space." The new feature will let you reserve meeting space in Thirty-Five (the Conference Center), The Hub and the Upper Lobby quickly and efficiently. Of course, you can always book space with the tower's hospitality manager, Jennifer Lishego.

There's nothing you need to do to get the new tile. You'll start seeing it on your app once it's been released – stay tuned for the release date announcement.

In addition to reserving space, the Reserve Space tile will let you see

availability for all meeting space, pricing and room layouts, including audiovisual capabilities. You'll also find a Preferred Vendors list featuring caterers (complete with menus!) who are familiar with the operations of the building and have the required certifications and indemnification forms on file with the tower. You always have the option to bring in your own vendor, but keep in mind that all outside vendors must provide a current COI, ServSafe certification and indemnification form.

Not on the U.S. Steel Tower app yet? Don't miss out. The app makes everything easier at the tower. In addition to offering valuable building information, the app lets you register visitors, submit work orders via Prism, sign up for Steel-Fit classes and register for building
